The scheduled Speakers include:

Peter Park served as the Manager of the Community Planning and Development Department for the City and County of Denver where he oversaw the Denver Transit Oriented Development Strategic Plan that serves as the foundation for Denver's future growth around FasTracks (the nation's largest regional transit expansion project). Prior to Denver, Peter served as City Planning Director in Milwaukee as replacement of the elevated Park East freeway with an at-grade boulevard that catalyzes new downtown development.

Scott Kubly currently serves as Managing Deputy Commissioner of the Chicago Department of Transportation, overseeing planning and project development, traffic engineering, and the bikesharing program.

Michael Moore is the Director of Transportation and Engineering for the City of Cincinnati and has served the City since 1994. He previously worked in the capacity of City Architect, where he managed several projects including the "The Banks" Street Grid, the Cincinnati Streetcar Feasibility Study, the City's Gateway Program, and several neighborhood infrastructure and urban design projects.
