

RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT PROGRAM ACTIVITIES 2012 SECOND QUARTER

Every four years the Pittsburgh City Code requires the City to recertify every Residential Parking Permit Program district. This recertification requires the City to verify that the program is both wanted and needed in each district. We can also review neighborhood management plan issues at this time as well. During the second quarter of 2012 the Department of City Planning will be working on recertification and management plan issues in the following Residential Parking Permit Program areas:

- T (Beechview)
- Q (North Oakland)
- X (Shadyside)

The number of recertifications that we complete is dependent on available time and resources.

The City Code permits minor expansions. Minor expansions add streets to an existing permit parking district on an accelerated schedule if it has less than 10 block faces or 100 parking spaces. This requires both that the residents petition into the program and the city has a parking survey performed, but does not require a preliminary survey, community meeting or public hearing. We will be responding to requests for the expansion programs on. The following are the requests that are currently active:

- A (Lawrenceville)
- E (South Oakland)
- M (South Oakland)
- O (Homewood South)
- Y (Shadyside)
- BB (Bloomfield/Friendship)

The number of minor expansions that we complete is dependent on available time and resources.

At this time we have active requests to create new districts or have major expansions proposed in:

- Point Breeze near the intersection of Fifth Avenue and Penn Avenue
- Mexican War Streets between N. Federal Street and Monterey Street
- Central Lawrenceville north of Butler Street between 40th and 46th Streets
- Squirrel Hill around 1500 block of Murray Avenue
- Southside Flats around Armstrong Field.

Also we are jointly working with the office of Councilman Patrick Dowd and Lawrenceville United to develop a parking strategy for the residents of Lawrenceville to combat the continual parking issues that consist around The Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh.
