

2. Schenley Skating Rink Addition (Conceptual and Final)

Jesse Gidley, Lami Grubb Architects

The Department of Public Works wants to make the facility more accessible to the public, with the addition of an elevator tower and accessible parking, and to improve the banquet facilities that are in use throughout the year.

The goal of Lami Grubb was to maintain the existing architecture with the new addition. Plant material would be pre-grown and used on the elevator shaft to minimize the impact on the park setting. There will be a party room on the first and expanded banquet facilities on the second floor.

Indovina noticed that there is a budget for an artist and salvaged material available. He suggested that another artistic intervention might be more favorable. Slavick agreed that they shouldn't prescribe how to use the copper, and that the project remain open.

Brown noted that Public Works will work with the Public Art Division to do the art project that is in the plan.

Luckett asked why the project is over a million dollars and the allocated art money is \$5000. Goodley responded that \$5000 is the artist fee and an additional amount of \$12,000 for materials, approximately \$17,000 with labor and material. The \$5,000 is design only and the rest is for fabrication. Brown noted that 1% of the project would be \$14,000, but for this particular project they were able to allocate \$17,000.

Slavick asked for clarification on the plant coverage: is it just for the elevator shaft or for other areas of the building? Goodley responded that it will just be for the elevator shaft.

3. Shiloh Street Gateway Sign (Conceptual Approval)

Ilyssa Manspeizer, Mount Washington Community Development Corporation, Sarah Thompson, Pashek Associates

Manspeizer described the project, noting that the need for signage to draw visitors down to the business district is the biggest part of the plan. The MWCDC has gone through a lot of community process, there is a third public meeting this evening and a fourth in a month.

Thompson presented the three options for the signage, which borrows from the existing architecture from the existing structure. There is an existing trellis piece that juts out into the sidewalk. The original concept incorporates that structure. The second option adds more
