

§ 416.01 - MINOR STREET OBSTRUCTIONS (EXTENSION OF PREMISES); PERMIT REQUIRED.

- (a) Except for emergencies, no person shall erect barricades or scaffolds, cover or uncover walkways, erect or relocate utility poles on sidewalks or roadways or temporary bridges, or display merchandise ("extension of premises"), or set out furniture ("extension of premises"), on a sidewalk, or make any curb cuts or lay or repair a sidewalk without first obtaining a permit from the Department of Public Works.
- (b) By accepting a permit, the permittee agrees, where applicable:
 - (1) To remove or relocate at its own expense all installations from the public street, sidewalk or other public way upon five (5) days written notice from the City requesting the removal; and
 - (2) To hold the City nonliable for removal or relocation and to indemnify it for any costs incurred as a result of removal or relocation; and
 - (3) To notify abutting and adjoining property owners of the obstruction five (5) days prior to its installation, unless under emergency conditions, in which case a reasonable attempt shall be made to notify abutting and adjoining property owners prior to the installation of the obstructions.
 - (4) To hold harmless the City for any losses to persons or property arising from the display of wares or arts and crafts or the setting out of furniture on the sidewalk ("extension of premises").
 - (5) To remove from the sidewalk all extension of premises wares and furniture at the end of the business day, or by 10:00 p.m., whichever is earlier.
- (d) *Over the street banners.*
- (e) *Over the sidewalk banners.*
- (f) *Regulations.*
 - (1) *Banners.*
 - (2) *Extension of premises:* The Director of the Department of Public Works shall issue regulations governing the display of merchandise and the setting out of furniture on the sidewalk ("extension of premises").

§ 416.02 - PERMIT FEE FOR MINOR STREET OBSTRUCTIONS.

EXTENSION OF PREMISES RULES AND REGULATIONS

Purpose: The purpose of the Extension of Premises Regulations is to encourage businesses such as coffee shops, bookstores, art galleries, florists and the like to expand their space onto their sidewalks and to create a pedestrian-friendly environment for visitors and residents alike to stroll the streets and enjoy the variety of merchandise available. Or to simply sit and relax and enjoy the friendly business activity created in the neighborhood around them. At the same time, the extension of premises shall be neat, orderly, attractive and clean and shall never impede pedestrian or wheelchair traffic along the sidewalk.

Regulations:

Extension of premises expressly prohibits sales transactions of any kind on the sidewalk. No money is to be exchanged outside of the premises. This violation constitutes immediate forfeiture of the permit for one full year.

Extension of premises is for temporary display only, and not intended for permanent encroachments of any kind.

Extension of premises is for the use of the occupier of the premises directly abutting the business address. It is not for other businesses or vendors and is non transferable.

Extension of premises does not include the servicing of food and beverages which is addressed in ordinances governing sidewalk cafes at sections 416.03 and 911.04.A.68 of the Pittsburgh Code of Ordinances. Waiter service is prohibited.

Extension of Premises furniture or fixtures shall not be permanently attached to the structure of the building or sidewalk.

Extension of premises shall not include cooking or serving of prepared food on the sidewalk which is governed by Chapter 719 - Vendors and Peddlers, of Title Seven of the Pittsburgh Code of Ordinances and Title 4, 416.16, Extension of Premises for Cooking and Food Services.

The display shall not contain perishables unless wrapped and sealed. Beverages must be in a sealed container.

Extension of premises shall not include the presence of cooking or heating appliances in operation on the sidewalk. This is governed under a different permit in the Pittsburgh Code of Ordinances, 416.16 Extension of Premises for Cooking and Food Services.

Extension of premises furniture means only such furniture as shelves or tables for display purposes. Seating area is acceptable but does not include upholstered furniture. A maximum of two (2) tables & four (4) chairs for respite purposes may be used. Tables & chairs may be substituted with one (1) bench not to exceed five (5) feet in length. DPW has the right to review set up and amend for safety reasons.

Extension of Premises must leave enough room for unimpeded pedestrian passage. Sidewalks up to ten (10) feet in width shall leave a minimum of five (5) feet of sidewalk clear of obstructions to allow unimpeded pedestrian and disabled pedestrian traffic. Sidewalks over ten (10) feet in width shall leave a minimum of seven (7) feet of sidewalk clear of obstructions to allow unimpeded pedestrian and disabled pedestrian traffic. No obstruction shall be placed within thirty (30) inches of the face of any curb, or within five (5) feet of any fire exit, fire hydrant, or building corner.

All extension of premises wares and furniture shall be stored inside the premises at the end of the business day and removed from the sidewalk no later than 10PM.

The extension of premises permit shall be placed in plain view within the premises preferably against the business front window.

Penalty: Failure to comply with the provisions of Pittsburgh Code of Ordinances, Title Four, Article I, regarding use of the public right of way or with these regulations shall result in revocation of the extension of premises permit in addition to other applicable enforcement measures of Article I of Title Four of the Pittsburgh Code of Ordinances.
