

DRINKING WATER WARNING
BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Your Water Supply in the Waterworks Mall, St. Margret Hospital, Aspinwall Borough and 1028,
1034, 1032, 1050, 1060, and 1090 Freeport Rd **May Be At Increased Risk From Microbial**
Contamination.

We routinely monitor the conditions in the distribution system. On Friday, 4/11/14, we experienced a loss of positive water pressure due to water main break. A loss of positive water pressure is a signal of the existence of conditions that could allow contamination to enter the distribution system through back-flow by back-pressure or back-siphonage. As a result, there is an increased chance that the water may contain disease-causing organisms.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a rolling boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using; or use bottled water. You should use boiled or bottled water for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.

Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites, which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.

These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. What happened? What is being done?

A 60" diameter water line break was detected in Etna. As a result, water service was interrupted for the
above listed areas. The break is isolated and the repair is underway. PWSA will ensure that the water line is
properly disinfected. The boil water notice/advisory will remain in effect until such time as pressure is restored to
the system pending water quality results from the laboratory

We will inform you when all corrective actions have been completed and when you no longer need to boil your water.
