

Smallman Street Water and Sewer Line Project

OVERVIEW - What is happening in your neighborhood?

- As part of its Capital Improvement Program, PWSA will perform a water line and sewer line construction project on Smallman Street, between 16th Street and 21st Street in the 2nd Ward of the City of Pittsburgh.

SCOPE - What can you expect?

- Approximately 1,650 feet of 36-inch waterline, 2,000 feet of 12-inch waterline, 1,800 feet of storm sewer and 2,200 feet and sanitary sewer will be installed.

SCHEDULE - When will your neighborhood be affected?

- Anticipated construction start – late April-early May 2018
- Anticipated construction completion – November-December 2018

FYI - How will your neighborhood be affected?

- The Contractor must implement and maintain erosion and sediment control measures, parking restrictions, traffic controls, while constructing water and sewer lines.
- Water service to customers will be maintained throughout the project. Planned water service interruptions will be performed with ample notice, and should take less than 8-hours per occurrence. Please provide PWSA with updated contact information to allow for timely communication by going to www.pgh2o.com and clicking “Update Contact Info”.

- Work is anticipated to occur 24 hours per day to complete work on schedule.
- Offsite material and equipment storage areas have been established for this work. Only public land, or private land with owner permission, shall be used and will be restored following project completion.
- PARKING: ALCO’s parking lot on 15th Street and Smallman Street will be opened during the weekends for visitor parking for a fee.
- TRAFFIC: One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction and concrete jersey barriers will isolate the boundaries of construction.
- A pedestrian path will be maintained throughout the project.

With whom is PWSA coordinating?

- To date, PWSA has coordinated with The City of Pittsburgh Department of Public Works, The Urban Redevelopment Authority, Buncher Group, and McCaffrey Development Corporation, the PA Department of Environmental Protection, the Allegheny County Conservation District, and the office of Councilwoman Deborah Gross on this project.
