POSITION: Equipment Repair Specialist
DIVISION: Water Production

UNION: This position is included in the Pittsburgh Joint Collective Bargaining Committee (PJCBC) will be filled in accordance with the provisions of the Collective Bargaining Agreement.

DUTIES: Repairs, services and performs routine preventive maintenance and diagnostic tests on various types of equipment (e.g. burner blower, chemical pumps and feeders, mobile and stationary compressors, conveyers, crusher, Cushman Scooters, dust silo, exhaust fans, filter controls, flocculators, generators, meters, mowers, power saws, pumps, pump control valves, small engines including diesel engines, storage silos, tractors, various power machines, water pumps, hydraulic systems, chlorination equipment, etc.); inspects all mechanical equipment, engines, etc., and replaces appropriate parts; tests mobile and stationary equipment to assess mechanical problems and to ensure proper repairs as required; prepares parts orders for purchase as requested or required; keeps accurate records on maintenance of equipment; may assist in the unloading of material (e.g., liquid asphalt, mineral filter, etc.); may operate appropriate equipment (e.g., cutting torch, hoisting cranes, etc.) as requested or required; may drive truck of less than one ton in daily routine and may drive trucks (less than 26,001 pounds) as assigned; may work all shifts; performs activities and functions of related lower-level personnel as assigned or required; performs such other related tasks and duties that are assigned or required.

KNOWLEDGE/ABILITIES: Considerable knowledge of the procedures and techniques in the repair and servicing of various types of equipment; of the mechanical operation of various types of equipment and engines; and of the safety hazards and safety precautions of the work. Ability to operate various types of equipment and engines; to accurately use various diagnostic tools and instruments related to the work; to maintain and properly perform minor to major repairs on equipment and engines; to lift and move heavy objects; to work from ladders and scaffolding; to work outdoors in all weather; to maintain records and prepare accurate reports; and to establish and maintain effective working relationships with supervisors, associates and the general public.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

Applicants must become domiciled within the City of Pittsburgh at time of appointment and remain domiciled within the City of Pittsburgh throughout employment with the PWSA. Verification of City domicile is required at time of appointment.

Applicants must present a current, valid Class C (Class 1) Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Operator's License prior to appointment. A valid driver's license must be maintained throughout employment.

EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS: In order to be considered eligible for this position, the application must clearly show three years repairing, servicing, and performing routine preventive maintenance on various kinds of mechanical equipment and engines (e.g. mobile and stationary compressors, flocculators, water pumps, etc.) OR an equivalent combination of education and experience.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The physical demands described here are those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.
