

INVITATION FOR BIDS

The URBAN REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF PITTSBURGH will receive bids for the installation of approximately 2200 square yards (SY) of cement concrete pavement, 9000 square feet (SF) of porous pavement, 2000 SY of superpave wearing and binder courses, 2300 SY of cement concrete sidewalk, 3000 lineal feet (LF) of concrete curb, 1900 LF of storm sewer, manholes, inlets, excavation, 2000 LF of waterline, 1000 LF of sanitary sewer, along with associated manholes, inlets, valves, and hydrants, bio retention areas, street lighting system and street trees, and bio retention area plantings and all work incidental thereto required to complete **Bakery Square 2.0 Site Preparation Contract No. 1** until 11:00 a.m. prevailing time on Thursday, the 26th day of September, 2013, at its office, 11th Floor, 200 Ross Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15219, at which time all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud in the 10th Floor Conference Room.

Contract documents will be available on **Wednesday, September 4, 2013** at the Engineering and Construction Department, 11th Floor, 200 Ross Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15219, upon a non-refundable payment of **ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY (\$150.00) DOLLARS**. **The bidder's check or money order should be made payable to the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh. CHECK OR MONEY ORDER ONLY. Contract documents will not be mailed.**

A pre-bid meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 11, 2013, URA offices, 200 Ross Street, at 1:30 p.m. in the Wherrett Room on the 13th floor. **Attendance by prospective bidders is strongly suggested.**

A certified check or bank draft payable to the order of the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh, negotiable U.S. Government Bonds (at par value), or a satisfactory Bid Bond executed by the Bidder and an acceptable surety, in a dollar amount equal to 5% of the total bid for Bakery Square 2.0 Site Preparation Contract No. 1, shall be submitted for each bid. The bid submittal must include the Bid, Non-collusion Affidavit of Prime Bidder, Bid Bond, Statement of Bidder's Qualifications, and the Certificate of Minority and Women's Participation.

Wages paid on this project shall not be less than the minimum wages determined by the U.S. Department of Labor as set forth in the Contract Documents.

The Contractor will be required to comply with all applicable Equal Employment Opportunity requirements for Federally-Assisted construction contracts. The Contractor must assure that employees and applicants for employment are not discriminated against because of their age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, or political or union affiliation.

The Contractor will be required to comply with the following laws, rules and regulations:

Contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act as amended (42 U.S.C. 7401 et seq.) See 40 CFR, Parts 50-99, for relevant regulations of the EPA.

Contractor shall comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback Act" (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Part 3).

Contractor shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 276-a to a-7) as supplemented by Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Part 5), and with the Contract Work Hours and Safety Act (40 U.S.C. 327 et seq.) as supplemented by Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Parts 5 and 1926).

Contractor shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Executive Order 11625 (Minority Business Enterprise) and Executive Order 12138 (Women Business Enterprise) and other federal statutes and regulations in Part II of the General Conditions.

Bidders will be required to submit the package of certifications included with the contract documents relating to the Equal Employment Opportunity and the participation of Minority and Women's Business Enterprises. The Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh requires that all bidders complete and submit an MBE/WBE Solicitation and Commitment Statement along with the bid.

The Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any informality in the bidding.

Bids may be held by the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days from the date of the opening of Bids for the purpose of reviewing the Bids and investigation of Bidders prior to awarding the Contract.
