During the meeting, Kolke presented to members of the Homewood Community Development Collaborative and neighbors that: 1) The project team is seeking approval by the Art Commission 2) The *Homewood Walk of Fame* is resident driven and was envisioned through the Homewood Comprehensive Community Plan 3) Public engagement was completed and 14 names were submitted for the installation.
