
§ 197.04 USE OF AUTHORITY AND PUBLIC PROPERTY.

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- (c) No public official or City employee shall use or permit the use of his or her official title, insignia or position in connection with any private business from which the public official or City employee receives compensation.
- (d) No public official or City employee shall use or allow to be used any City facilities, property, staff or information obtained in the course of his or her employment for personal use other than would be generally available to the public at large.

...

Regulation:

Version 1, simpler language:

City employees are allowed to wear uniforms while moonlighting if it helps their safety. For example, a police uniform makes an employee more visible while directing crowds or controlling traffic, and the uniform offers protection to an employee working to guard people or property.

Version 2, more formal:

It is permissible for City employees to wear uniforms while engaged in secondary employment for the purposes of safety and crowd control.
