Boundary Street from Panther Hollow to Fifth Avenue is an important bicycle and pedestrian connection from the Eliza Furnace Trail along the Monongahela River to Oakland. The Eliza Furnace Trail connects both Downtown Pittsburgh and the South Side to Oakland, the state's third largest economic hub.

Data collection during 2018 revealed that 85% of motorists were travelling over 38 miles per hour along Boundary Street.

The Boundary Street Traffic Calming project will include 5 speed humps on Boundary Street between Joncaire Street and Forbes Avenue, and signage to help direct bicyclists and pedestrians to and from the Eliza Furnace Trail to Ellsworth Avenue, north of Forbes Avenue
