



Temporary Guidance for “No Parking” Signs

Department of Mobility and Infrastructure

Effective April 27, 2020

Effective immediately and until otherwise lifted by the Department of Mobility and Infrastructure (DOMI), the following guidelines for posting and communicating parking restrictions for permitted activity in the public right-of-way (ROW) shall apply.

- A “No Parking” sign will be provided to the applicant by DOMI. By accepting the permit and sign, the applicant agrees to follow these guidelines:
 - Signs must be posted a minimum of 48 hours in advance of parking restriction except where DOMI requires 72 hours.
 - The sign must be filled out with information provided by DOMI on the traffic obstruction permit:
 - Start and end work dates written as MM/DD/YY;
 - Restricted days written as “weekdays”, “weekends”, or “all days” unless otherwise directed by DOMI;
 - Restricted hours written as directed by DOMI;
 - Traffic Obstruction permit number;
 - Type of construction permit (e.g. opening, dumpster);
 - Address or street where parking is restricted;
 - Name or company of the permit holder.
 - When required by DOMI, permits for utility work must communicate parking restrictions by robo calls, door hangers, or other means.
 - “No Parking” signs issued for dumpsters and moving pods must be posted on the moving pod or dumpster for the duration that the dumpster or POD is permitted in the ROW.
 - When necessary, DOMI will coordinate notice to community groups. By accepting the permit and "No Parking" sign, the applicant agrees to provide materials required to adequately notify the community at the request of the department.
 - Although construction and other activities are resuming, the City remains under a stay-at-home order from Governor Wolf. Applicants should expect that the ability of the Department of Public Safety to enforce parking restrictions will be limited. Applicants should plan accordingly.
 - Some situations may require more involved steps to ensure that residents are aware of work in their neighborhoods and that contractors can complete work as safely and quickly as possible. These situations will be on a case-by-case basis and will be different depending on the area.

The “No Parking” sign provided by DOMI is only for the referenced permit. Anyone using the sign for unauthorized use or distribution is in violation of the Pittsburgh City Code and subject to fines, penalties, and corrective measures within.
